



QUICK FACTS

LOCATION

Cochrane lies on the forty-ninth parallel. As such, its latitude is the same as the greater part of the border between the United States and Western Canada. Cochrane is served by Highway 11, the northern route of the Trans-Canada Highway, and by the Ontario Northland Transportation Commission, which offer passenger train service to Moosonee at the James Bay Coast.



RECREATION

Cochrane is a recreationally driven community in all four seasons of the year. Home of the Tim Horton Event Centre, the only Bike Share program in Northern Ontario, a local supervised community beach (in the middle of town) that allows

people to enjoy all watersports.

Surrounded by vast rural areas, the adventurer will find extensive kilometers of trails for cycling, hiking, ATV driving, snowmobiling and other power sports. Some near water bodies that offer the perfect fishing conditions and others near sandy beaches perfect for a camping getaway in the Northern wilderness, which is Cochrane's backyard.





"CHIMO"

Residents in this town "Chimo" to greet one another during the winter carnival. It is a Inuit word meaning: "I am friendly" or "Welcome. The giant polar bear statue, the town's mascot, greets our visitors at the entrance of town alongside the Cochrane welcome sign. You've seen this style of sign before; in Toronto! More specifically at the beginning of Younge Street. Did you know Cochrane is the most northern point of Younge Street? What better way to commemorate this than by having a twin sign?

POLAR BEARS

Did you know that Chimo isn't the only polar bear in Cochrane? Cochrane is home to the largest polar bear enclosure in North America which occupies several real polar bears! You can purchase a season pass and visit the bears any time of the year because the facility is open 363 days a year.

TIM HORTON

Tim Horton was born on January 12, 1930 in Cochrane Ontario. He is the creator and founder of the Canadian doughnut and coffee franchise, Tim Hortons. He is also known for playing in the NHL over the course of 24 consecutive seasons from 1948 to 1974. The sports complex in town is named "The Tim Horton's Event Center" in commemoration.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF COCHRANE

CHOO-CHOO! NEXT STOP COCHRANE, ONTARIO!

The Town of Cochrane owes its existence to the trans-Canadian rail network. Located on the junction of the Canadian National Railway and the Ontario Northland Transportation Commission (ONTC) rail line, previously the Temiskaming and Northern Ontario Railway, many came to work on the rail line and settled in Cochrane in the early 1900's. Cochrane soon developed other important industries around the rail line, including agriculture, forestry and other commerce, merchant stores, bakeries among other business ventures necessary for people working in the area.





Although many settlers arrived in 1906, like many Canadian town sites, populations of First Nations resided or migrated through these geographical areas. The aboriginal heritage that characterizes the landscape of Cochrane is that of the Cree, Ojibwa and Algonquin ancestry; traditions that can still be found within our community today. The first crossing of the Cochrane town site would have been of settlers on their way to trade fur in the Moosonee area while travelling the Abitibi River.

"THE TOWN BETWEEN THE TWO RIVERS"

The Town of Cochrane was initially called the "Town Between the Two Rivers", because the town site was laid out on the Commando Indians Little Lakes Campgrounds (now Commando Lake), which was the center point between the Abitibi River and the Frederickhouse River, on the Old Overland Packet Trail to Moosonee. Only later after the town was formally incorporated in 1910, was the Town named Cochrane after the Hounourable Frank Cochrane, the Minister of Lands, Forests and Mines at that time.





FOUNDED ON HARD WORK & DETERMINATION

The Town of Cochrane has faced its share of traumatic events, aside from raging world epidemics, Cochrane was the casualty of three major fires; the fires of 1910, 1911 and 1916. At three different times during its existence Cochrane had to rebuild everything; its businesses, homes, and recreational facilities.


Although some fires were bigger than others, many took refuge in the surrounding lakes. The fire of 1916, which spread from the town of Matheson northward to Cochrane left over 200 people dead or missing, 22 of which resided in Cochrane, their names can be found at the memorial site of the 1916 Fire at the intersection of Genier Rd. and Concession 6 & 7.




BUILT FOR GREATNESS & ENGINEERED FOR SUCCESS

Uncharacteristic of other northern railway towns, Cochrane was built and engineered, at the time, to become a metropolitan center for the North, so that it could accommodate all rail line shipments heading to the western provinces. Many of these developments can still be seen today; Cochrane's roads are wide, just take a look at Railway Street and Sixth Avenue! This intention led the way to ensure that Cochrane was founded and prospered on a diverse economy: rail workers, farmers, loggers, miners and entrepreneurs. All of these industries still support the development of the town today.

CLIMATE







Lillabelle Lake is smaller body of water located just outside the urban core and near the municipal airport. It is a prominent lake for fishing in the winter and float planes, to leave for fly in fishing trips.

LAKE LOUISE

Lies about thirty minutes from the Town of Cochrane, and is a gorgeous waterfront for homes and travelers.

Silver Queen Lake is a small cottage community, located about 30 minutes from the Town of Cochrane.
